This improved service will not require our customers to pay more for their existing services. However, some of the upgraded services you will have access to are:


High Speed Internet up to 20M with synchronous speeds; meaning your upload is equal to your download speeds.

Don't Get Hooked by Phishing

MTelecom wants you to be informed and aware as you go about your online activities. One potential scam to watch out for is phishing, where crooks try to get you to divulge personal information through the use of legitimate-looking emails and websites. For example, you may receive an email that looks like it's from your bank, saying your account information needs to be updated immediately for security purposes. DON'T FALL FOR IT. The scammers are trying to commit identity theft to gain access to your accounts.

Awareness of phishing tactics is the best way to avoid becoming the latest victim of these online thieves. Here's how to protect yourself:

1. No reply. It sounds obvious but don't reply to unsolicited messages, especially those asking for personal information. Legitimate companies never solicit information this way.



- **2. Don't click links.** Links in phishing messages appear to go to a legitimate website but actually redirect you elsewhere. Instead of clicking, call the company using a phone number you know is legitimate. Or type the company's Web address directly into the browser to learn how to contact the company.
- **3. Not by email.** Don't provide personal information by email—it's not secure. When providing information through a website, make sure it's secure by checking to see if https:// is in the Web address and a padlock icon appears on the browser's status bar.
- **4. Antivirus, all the time.** Make sure antivirus and firewall software is always running and updated. This helps to keep viruses, worms, spyware, and keystroke loggers off your computer.

If you should fall prey to a phishing scheme, take these steps immediately:

- Contact your financial institution. Let bank officials know what happened and they can block access to your accounts and often reimburse you for fraudulent charges.
- **2. Contact credit reporting agencies.** Protect your credit by letting these organizations know about the incident. The three main U.S. credit reporting agencies are TransUnion (www.transunion.com), Equifax (www.equifax.com), and Experian (www.experian.com).
- **3. Contact the FTC.** The Federal Trade Commission investigates and prosecutes consumer fraud. You can file a complaint at www.ftc.gov/bcp/edu/microsites/ idtheft as well as learn more about identity theft and how it works.

Phishers may try to lure you in, but you don't have to bite. Be careful!

Broadcasters Looking to Raise Fees Again Are KMTV rates going up?

Tn the coming months, KMTelecom **⊥** will begin negotiations with local broadcasters (NBC, ABC, Fox, and CBS) for retransmission consent fees. Retransmission consent fees are the fees that the local broadcasters charge KMTelecom and other cable TV providers to carry their networks on our system. What used to be a free channel to operators has now become a significant revenue source to the broadcasters. Also, the networks have increasingly added bundles of cable channels into the negotiations requiring us to take more channels than we want at prices higher than we want to pay.

As always, we will do our best to negotiate a fair rate with the broadcasters but if past experience is any indicator, the negotiations are typically a one-way street. We have two options—pay the exorbitant rate or lose the network. In the past, we have chosen to continue carriage of these channels at the higher rates. However, we want to make our customers aware that there could also be "blackouts" of channels during these negotiations if the broadcasters try to bully us into an unreasonable rate.

Unfortunately, what all this means to our video customers is a very probable rate increase in 2012. Unless we see regulation and changes at the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in regards to the rules surrounding retransmission fees, we will be forced to continue to raise our rates to cover these increased costs.
