Fiber Construction Update for Dodge Center

KMTelecom, in partnership with the State of Minnesota and the City of Dodge Center, is working to overbuild the City of Dodge Center with a fiber network that will be one of the most advanced telecommunications networks in the country. Construction crews from A&A Electric and Underground are preparing to bring Fiber to the Home (FTTH) to this community.

The map provides a visual of the construction area, shown in green. The other two areas (aqua and yellow) currently have fiber, and the residents in those areas have access to the benefits of fiber internet.

All residential homes in the City of Dodge Center will convert to fiber, thanks to the city receiving the 2021 Minnesota Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV). KMTelecom, with our own funding, will also be bringing fiber to the businesses who pre-commit to a fiber conversion.



KMTelecom's goal is to handle this project with the utmost respect to you and your property. Construction crews will notify you before they start construction on your property. Construction will begin this summer 2023.

Today's Wi-Fi Routers Offer Parental Controls

Parental controls are valuable tools, since they empower you to manage your children's internet usage at home. You can prevent exposure to potentially dangerous or inappropriate content and set limits on when each child can be online and for how many hours.

While the specific parental control features and capabilities will vary somewhat from router to router, you'll likely be able to do the following:

Filter Website Content

Filtering enables you to restrict or blacklist certain types of websites that aren't suitable for children. Some systems have an on/off switch that blocks adult content, while others have age-based controls (for child, pre-teen, teen, or adult) or allow you to block certain types of content based on topics and keywords.

Group Devices

Many routers allow parents to group devices by users. For example, you could schedule Wi-Fi shutoff for a younger child's smartphone and tablet on weeknights at 7:30 p.m., turn off your teen's desktop and gaming console at 9:30 p.m., and keep your own connection active at all times.



Limit Screen Time

Using your router's scheduling feature, you can curb the amount of screen time available for your children by restricting usage and creating internet breaks for activities such as homework, chores, and dinnertime. You can also schedule a time to shut off internet access on school nights and a different time for weekends.

Pause Wi-Fi

Another commonly available option is to pause Wi-Fi for a child, outside of the normal schedule, should distractions need to be kept to a minimum for any reason. You may be able to sync your router with a virtual assistant such as Siri and just say, "Siri, pause Tommy's Wi-Fi."

Review Reports

Want to know the sites your children visit and how long they spend on each? Today's routers typically give parents access to these types of detailed reports.

988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline Offers Hope

Too many people experience suicidal crisis or mental health-related distress without the support and care they need. However, help is readily available.

By calling or texting 988, a person can connect directly with a mental health professional via the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline (formerly known as the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline). The 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is a national network of more than 200 crisis centers, staffed 24/7 to provide confidential assistance. These centers are supported by local and state sources as well as the Department of Health and Human Services' Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

Veterans can press "1" after dialing 988 to connect directly to the Veterans Crisis Lifeline which serves our nation's Veterans, service members, National Guard and Reserve members, and those who support them. For texts, Veterans should continue to text the Veterans Crisis Lifeline short code: 838255.





You know those personality quizzes you see on Facebook—the ones that promise to reveal which Marvel character you most resemble or guess your age? They may not be as harmless as they appear at first glance.

The more information you share about yourself by responding to Facebook quizzes, the more risk you have of the information being misused. That's because these quizzes typically ask the same types of questions that are used as security questions for online accounts, such as "What was the model of your first car?" or "Where did you go to high school?"

Scammers could do serious damage with the answers you provide to Facebook quizzes. The Federal Trade Commission warns that scammers phish for answers to security question data through these quizzes and could potentially acquire private information from you to hack your bank accounts or steal your identity. Scammers might also hack social media accounts and send malware links to your friends under the guise of sharing a quiz, lead you to a website with dangerous downloads, or have malicious links included in the questions.

The Better Business Bureau offers these tips to avoid being scammed by quizzes on Facebook or other social media:

- Be skeptical. Before answering a quiz, figure out who created it. Is it a brand you trust? Just because something appears to be fun and innocent, doesn't mean there isn't an inherent risk.
- Remove personal details from your profile. Don't share information like a phone number or home address on social media accounts.
- Don't give answers to common security questions. Be cautious if the questions in a quiz ask for things like your mother's maiden name, the street you grew up on, previously owned vehicles, or favorite foods.
- Monitor friend requests. Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. Also be wary of a second friend request from someone you are already connected with; the second profile may be an impostor trying to access your data and your Friends list.

The next time you're bored and tempted to answer the questions in a "fun" Facebook quiz, don't do it. It's not fun becoming the victim of a scam.
